Services for veterans include rapid re-housing, case management and homeless prevention. A large focus is heavily placed on increasing veteran's employment potential through job readiness and retention training.

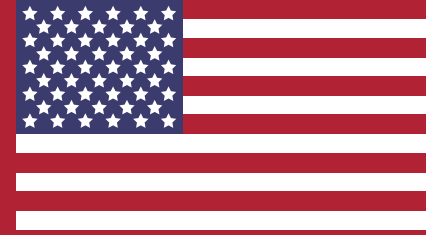

## WHAT IS A VETERAN?



A 'veteran' is defined as: *a person who served in the active military, naval, or air service and who was discharged or released from under conditions other than dishonorable.*

## GET HELP WITH HOUSING: SUPPORTIVE SERVICES FOR VETERAN FAMILIES (SSVF)

Funded by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, the Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF) program provides supportive services to very low-income Veteran families living in or transitioning to permanent housing. The program offers eligible Veterans and their families:

- Case management
- Transportation services
- Benefits claims
- Child care services
- Rental assistance
- Resource & Referral

## GOT AN APPOINTMENT?

 After you have scheduled your appointment, please bring the following items and documents with you:

- Photo I.D.
- Undeleted DD-214 that shows discharge status
- Proof of income for all adult family members
- Social Security cards for all family members
- Housing payment receipts (if currently housed)
- Copies of landlord agreements



## LET US HELP YOU GET EMPLOYED: HOMELESS VETERANS REINTEGRATION PROGRAM (HVRP)

Funded by the U.S. Department of Labor, the Homeless Veterans Reintegration Program (HVRP) is a federal program that focuses on addressing the barriers facing homeless and at-risk veterans and helps reintegrate individuals into meaningful employment within the labor force.

The program offers employment readiness, workshops, job counseling, resume preparation, job placement, and retention services. The HVRP team also ensures that participants receive essential supportive services such as interview clothing, assistance with filing of VA Benefit claims, community referrals and resources, and a full computer lab.
